




APIDA Virtual New Year Celebration





0 **Glenn Anthony May Memorial Scholarship** С A man of many talents, Glenn Anthony May was a tenured professor of history at the University of Oregon where he spent 32 years teaching courses on Southeast Asia, Vietnam, U.S. Foreign Relations, and the Cold War, among others. His own academic research focused on the Philippines where he spent a great deal of time fully immersing himself in the culture and language of the land. Prof. May authored five books on the Philippines and a sixth one on the Mexican migrant community in Oregon. In tribute to Prof. May's academic interests in and love of the Philippines, this fund aims to provide scholarships to students who are a.) Filipino or of Filipino heritage and/or b.) pursuing a field of study related to Southeast Asian studies. F

- All students are welcome to apply including those living outside of Oregon. Students must be a.) Filipino or of Filipino heritage and/or b.) pursuing a field of study related to Southeast Asian
