
### APIDA Virtual New Year Celebration



SIMS is hosted by the California NanoSystems Institute and will be held in-person or virtually depending on local COVID-19 restrictions.

- Serve on the SIMS student selection committee

**UC SANTA BARBARA Undergraduate Research & Creative Activities**


