Each interview may take about 60-120 minutes long and will include an educational journey mapping activity. The interview will consist of questions regarding students' background, family, college life, citizenship status, and overall experience at the campus(es) you are or were enrolled in. Apart from the interview, observation memo(s) and a letter-writing activity will be part of this study. Students will also be offered a \$20 Amazon or Target gift card for their participation.
