what's a zine?

"A zine is a self-published, non-commercial print-work that is typically produced in small, limited batches.

Zines can touch on a variety of topics from music and art, to politics, sexuality, humor and personal memoir.

Their content may be written, drawn, printed, collaged, or any other form of combining words and imagery—a zine's structure may be narrative, journalistic, comic-like, or completely abstract."

workshop overview:

- **workshop one (2/4):** intro to zine-making w/ UCSB librarians, how to access archives, & meet the student orgs involved.
- **workshops two (2/18) and three (3/4):** drop in creative workspace to work on zine pages & process archival history together.
- **ongoing submission basis:** you don't have to attend any/all of the workshops to contribute to the zine. you can submit as much as you want, whenever you want and interpret the zine in any way you like! this is a free, creative project where you get to show you!

what's the theme about?

"Know history, know self. No history, no self," is a popular interpretation of a quote by Jose Rizal, a Filipino revolutionary.

By going through our collective history of the Asian Pacific Islander Desi American (APIDA) community on campus, we can better connect with our identities, each other and the cultural context within which we can find our experiences. We also want to step into the power of our experiences now by expressing who we are in this moment and building onto this shared history. Our stories then and now carry meaning and tell a story of what it means to be us, so let's document it together!

Using the archives held in the ARC, current contributions from student organizations, and your own words/pictures, we hope you'll join us in collectively & creatively piecing together who we are.

Call to participate in a study

The purpose of this study is to explore the experiences of Asian American students who are U.S. citizens in a mixed-status family. Although empirical evidence exists regarding the hardships these families endure, little is known about Asian American undergraduates who are members of these families and if their race, ethnicity, citizenship status, or family's mixed-status influences or impacts their educational experiences. The findings of this study will be used to strengthen the direction of my dissertation about this student population, while long-term objectives of the study will be focused on increasing American colleges and universities' understanding of these students' challenges and how they can better serve and support them.

This study seeks to explore the educational experiences of Asian Americans who are U.S. citizens and part of a family with at least one undocumented parent or sibling.

This study will be held safely online with no in-person contact and involves an interview, education journey mapping activity(ies), observations, and letter writing.

- U.S. citizens
- Identify as East Asian, Southeast Asian, South Asian, or Filipino
- Currently enrolled undergraduate or transfer at a UC, CSU, or California community college
- 18 years or older
- Identify as a member of a family with at least one undocumented parent or sibling
- Completed at least one undergraduate academic year as a public California campus


